

# **Sung Healing Eucharist**

Eucharists with Healing are held nine times a year at St. Michael's across the weekday and Sunday services. They are special times of reflection, restoration and wholeness, especially when one is busy or stressed.

During today's service, there will be "laying on of hands" by a commissioned member of St. Michael's Healing Team, whose hands will lightly rest on each person's head as this, or a similar prayer, is quietly spoken:

## "May the healing power of God - Father, Son and Holy Spirit - fill you with his peace and meet you today at your point of need in body, mind and spirit. In the name of Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen."

Following the laying on of hands, a priest will anoint with oil blessed specially for healing and wholeness, making the sign of the cross on each person's forehead and hands as this, or a similar prayer, is quietly spoken:

## "I anoint you in the name of the Father who loves you, the Son who redeems you, and the Spirit who gives you life."

Laying on of hands and anointing are practices which date back to the very early church and are mentioned many times in the Bible. They are offered at today's service but are not imposed. For some, the sacramental healing of the Eucharist alone may be preferred, and this option is always available. Introit

# **Preparation of the Table**

President

Lord Jesus Christ, you have invited us to come to this table. We have come from many places and experiences; we have come with all our differences; we have come to the place where journeys meet. You have reached out to all on the edge and called us into the heart of God.

# Eucharistic Prayer One

On the night that Jesus was betrayed he told us to prepare a place for him. And then he offered us a sign, a sign of how he would give himself to us to give us new life. He had always loved us, and now he showed us how perfect his love was.

While his disciples were eating, Jesus took a piece of bread in his hands, like this, and he blessed it: Blessed are you Lord God of all creation: through your goodness we have this bread to offer, which earth has given and human hands have made, it will become for us the bread of life. And then he said to them: This is my body broken for you, do this in remembrance of me.

# Silence

And then Jesus took a cup of wine, like this, and gave you thanks:

Blessed are you Lord God of all creation,

through your goodness we have this wine to offer,

fruit of the vine and work of human hands,

it will become for us the cup of salvation.

And then he said to them:

Drink this all of you,

This is my blood of the new covenant which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

Do this in remembrance of me.

His disciples did not understand these words; how could they understand?

But later they would see Christ's body broken, his love poured out – his death for us so that we might share his risen life.

The life he gave then, he shares with us now.

President

Lord Jesus Christ,

as we do in this place what you did once and for all, breathe your Holy Spirit upon us

# **Eucharistic Prayer Two**

Creator God, we thank and praise you, for by your Holy Spirit you parted the waters in creation and in the paths of liberation you journey with us through deep and shallow waters.

On the great night of Passover your children ate the bread of affliction, unleavened and unfinished, before they journeyed into the desert. In your Son Jesus, our friend and brother, you journeyed from heaven to earth, and from life to death to life again.

When your Son Jesus Christ met with his disciples on the night before he died, they recalled how, once before, the bread of affliction had become the bread of hope. Send down your Holy Spirit upon your Church, that in its affliction of body, mind or spirit it may discover in you the God of hope.

Sanctify this bread and cup, that they may be for us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ; who at supper with his disciples took bread, and gave you thanks, He broke it and gave it to them saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me. At the end of supper, taking the cup of wine, he gave you thanks, and said:

Drink this all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Broken yet healing God,

gather us together from many dwelling places

to feast together at one table.

Through this meal unite us with Jesus,

with one another,

and with the whole of creation.

Make your church, nourished by this bread and wine, a place of common voice with room for all.

Embolden your people to step out into the waters too deep for human understanding,

that they may spread their nets with the whole of creation.

Wounded as you are,

show us again how to walk a rising road.

Bring together the fresh water of healing and the salt water of justice in your Kingdom,

prepared for us through Jesus the way,

the truth and the life.

Hasten the day when all hopes are fulfilled,

all fears erased and all pain assuaged

in the fullness of your Son and the power of your Spirit, Holy Father.

All are invited to come to the communion rail to receive the bread and wine or a blessing. If you would like a blessing, please place your hands across your chest.

Laying on of hands and anointing is offered after communion. If you would prefer to have communion or a blessing without laying on of hands and anointing, please go to the side rail which is to the left as you face the altar.
